Purpose of Briefing

The purpose of the Briefing was to update the Council Members about ongoing items in the City.

City Manager

Asana Project Management Update

City Manager Mike Staffopoulos advised the presenter was not in attendance and the item would be deferred to a future briefing.

Lifesaving Station Branding

City Manager Mike Staffopoulos introduced the item, explaining the current branding was approved on an interim basis pending completion of the building's exterior shell improvements.

Deputy City Manager Karen Nelson presented renderings of the proposed permanent branding, along with the planned FY 2027 roof replacement. She also reported staff met with the Volunteer Life Saving Corps on June 1, 2026, to gather feedback on the proposed design.

A conversation ensued and it was the consensus of the Council to move forward with a resolution adopting the permanent branding, including:

- A neutral color metal roof.
- No red paint on the windowsills.
- The additional text as presented.
- Red and blue logos on the east side of the building.

Council also requested Parks and Recreation Director Jason Phitides confirm the final logo design with Jacksonville Beach Ocean Rescue before the resolution is finalized.

Urban Trails Project Update

Mr. Phitides introduced the item and consultant Lana Khanachet of NV5, who presented conceptual designs for the Seagate Avenue, 10th Street North, and 18th Avenue North corridors serving Fletcher High School, Fletcher Middle School, and San Pablo Elementary School.

A conversation ensued and it was the consensus of the Council for staff to proceed with the concept designs for each of the corridors. Parks and Recreation will check property boundaries for vehicle parking maximization, consult with the local schools impacted by the project and return to Council at the 30% design mark with a preliminary cost estimate. Parks and Recreation and Public Works will check with Florida Department of Transportation regarding the right-of-way. Staff will provide the Council with an update via email.

CIA Alumni Association

Deputy City Clerk Jodilynn Byrd presented a proposal for SPARK, an alumni association for graduates of the Citizen Information Academy (CIA). Ms. Byrd provided an overview of the program, including its purpose, goals, and key components.

A conversation ensued and it was the consensus of the Council for Ms. Byrd to move forward with implementation of the program and for Ms. Byrd to work with the Communications Department to refine the logo and branding, so they more closely align with the City's branding standards and current logo.

Alcohol Licensing on City Property

Senior Planner Christian Popoli explained a request was received by Dockside Seafood, the tenant of a city-owned building, to obtain a 4COP SRX alcohol license. Mr. Popoli explained the existing lease limited the tenant to a 2COP beer and wine license, so an amendment would be required.

A conversation ensued with City Attorney David Migut answering questions from the Council. It was the consensus of Council for Planning and Development to prepare an item amending the lease to allow a 4COP SRX license for formal consideration at a future Council meeting and City Attorney Migut to confirm the lease conditions were not transferable.

Summer Camp Ordinance / Policy

City Clerk Molly Alleger reported, following the April 2026 briefing and further internal review, staff recommended a stand-alone policy for camps and tournaments on the beach rather than amending Section 6-5(a) of the Code.

A conversation ensued and it was the consensus of Council for staff to move forward with the proposed changes and to bring back a resolution to Council for formal consideration at a future Council meeting.

Proposed State Legislation

Mr. Staffopoulos asked the City Council to identify legislative priorities for the City's legislative delegation to consider during the next legislative session.

A conversation ensued and the Council expressed interest in pursuing two potential legislative initiatives:

- Expanding the permitted uses of the Convention Development Tax
- Holding promoters of unpermitted events criminally liable for the consequences resulting from those events

The consensus of the Council was for Finance staff to prepare an outline of information regarding potential legislation to expand the permitted uses of the Convention Development Tax, including research on whether any changes would require a consolidated county carve-out or could be implemented through statewide legislation. The Council also requested the Police Department staff to develop an outline of proposed legislative recommendations regarding criminal liability for promoters of unpermitted events.

Both items will be brought back to the Council for further discussion and consideration at a future briefing.

Committee Assignment Report

Council Member Janson reported the federal appropriation request for the 13th Avenue South project, begun two years ago through Congressman Rutherford's office, passed the House and Senate, and the City was awarded \$850,000 of the \$1 million requested. Mr. Staffopoulos advised A second request of approximately \$1.3 million for new tankage at the water reclamation facility, which would also address Senate Bill 64 compliance, remained pending. He stated David Suarez, Public Works Engineer, would serve as project manager and had begun grant administration training.

Council Member Golding reported Governor DeSantis vetoed the sovereign immunity bill, citing concern the proposed reforms would encourage meritless lawsuits.

Miscellaneous City Manager's Items

Mr. Staffopoulos advised the City's budget hearing dates must be moved because the City of Jacksonville and the Duval County School Board took precedence in selecting dates and presented alternative date options for the first and second hearings. A poll would be emailed to the Council to reschedule the hearing dates.

Mr. Staffopoulos distributed a draft agenda for the upcoming City Council retreat scheduled for July 27, 2026.

Mr. Staffopoulos announced the new Director of Planning and Development would start July 20, 2026.

Mr. Staffopoulos reminded the Council the South Atlantic Lifeguard Association championships would be held July 15-16, 2026, in front of the Lifesaving Station.

Future Briefing Topics

Mayor Hoffman reported she had been accepted into Leadership Florida and asked whether the City Council travel and training budget could contribute toward the \$5,500 tuition. It was the consensus of Council to support 50% funding of the tuition, or \$2,750, subject to confirmation the Legislative Travel and Training budget may be used for that purpose.

Council Member Golding asked whether amplified sound from televisions at establishments operating under the newly approved extension of premises permit pilot program would be allowed after 10:00 p.m., noting the ordinance does not include an exemption from the City's noise ordinance. Mr. Migut stated he would consult with the Police Department and report back at the next Council briefing.

Mr. Migut informed the Council the e-bike ordinance was expected to return for first reading on August 3, 2026.

Council Member Golding recommended the Council review the Florida League of Cities property tax webinar and the Florida Formula Toolkit at flcities.com. She announced two Beaches Watch events: a police panel Wednesday at 7:00 P.M. at the library with Chief Smith, and a District 2 school board candidate forum on August 6, 2026, at 7:00 P.M. at Community Presbyterian Church in Atlantic Beach.

Ms. Hoffman asked about a possible fee reduction for the Supergirl Surf Pro event. Mr. Staffopoulos stated the Parks and Recreation Department would create a list of costs and fees and would bring it back for further discussion at the September 14, 2026, Council briefing.

Council Member Wouters asked Council Member Sutton to review the discussion from the June 8, 2026, City Council briefing regarding the ratification of department director appointments by the City Council.

The Briefing adjourned at 7:51 P.M.

BACKGROUND

The City and Volunteer Lifesaving Corps (VLSC) entered into a lease agreement for lease of the property located at 396 1st Avenue South, Jacksonville Beach, for one year commencing on June 1, 2024, and expiring on May 31, 2025, with an option to renew for five additional one-year terms.

On August 1, 2025, the first one-year renewal option was exercised with an effective date of May 31, 2025. Both parties wish to renew the Lease Agreement for the second one-year term, effective May 31, 2026 and terminating on May 31, 2027.

All other terms, conditions and provisions of the Lease Agreement remain the same.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

None. Under the lease agreement, VLSC is responsible for building maintenance and utilities.

**SECOND ONE-YEAR RENEWAL OF THE LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF
JACKSONVILLE BEACH AND THE VOLUNTEER LIFESAVING CORPS**

THIS SECOND ONE-YEAR RENEWAL OF THE LEASE AGREEMENT ("Second Renewal") is made and entered into as of May 31, 2026 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the City of Jacksonville Beach, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Florida, whose address is 11 N. Third Street, Jacksonville Beach, FL 32250 ("Lessor"), and the Volunteer Lifesaving Corps, a charitable not-for-profit organization whose mailing address is 427 North Third Street, Jacksonville Beach, FL 32250 ("Lessee"), to renew the Lease Agreement dated June 1, 2024 ("Lease Agreement") for lease of Lessor's real property located at 396 1st Avenue South, Jacksonville Beach, FL 32250 ("Property").

WHEREAS, on May 29, 2024, Lessor and Lessee entered into the Lease Agreement for lease of the Property for one year commencing on June 1, 2024, and expiring on May 31, 2025, with an option to renew for five additional one-year terms; and

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2025 (with an effective date of May 31, 2025), Lessor and Lessee entered into the First One-year Renewal of and First Amendment to the Lease Agreement, which renewed the Lease Agreement for one additional year from May 31, 2025, until May 31, 2026, and removed the requirement for Lessee to provide property damage and fire insurance coverage on the Property; and

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee wish to renew the Lease Agreement for the second one-year term.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and consideration contained herein, Lessor and Lessee agree:

1. The term of the Lease Agreement is hereby renewed for one additional year commencing on the Effective Date and terminating on May 31, 2027.
2. All other terms, conditions, and provisions of the Lease Agreement as amended but not otherwise specifically amended herein shall remain the same and in full force and effect.

SUBJECT:	Resolution No. 2219-2026 Establishing the Official Logo and Branding Design for the Jacksonville Beach Lifesaving Station

BACKGROUND

City Council adopted Resolution 2189-2025 on April 7, 2025, formally designating the Ocean Rescue building located at 2 Oceanfront North as the “Jacksonville Beach Lifesaving Station”. On that date, City Council also approved a temporary logo and branding design for the Lifesaving Station with direction to revisit the permanent designs after structural repairs and painting of the station were completed.

Staff met with members of the Volunteer Life Saving Corps (VLSC) on June 1, 2026, to discuss the official branding design and there was a consensus to modify the temporary branding as follows:

- Add “Since 1912” to the wording on the south side of the building
- Add the Jacksonville Beach Ocean Rescue logo and the VLSC logo to the east side of the building

City staff contracted with Crossbeam Signs and Fabrication to develop updated designs for the permanent branding of the station and presented those designs to City Council at the July 13 briefing. Upon adoption of the official logo and branding design, staff will work with Crossbeam to paint the building accordingly.

In addition to the official branding design, City Council and members of the VLSC agreed to replace the existing commemorative plaque on the east side of the building with a replica in weathered and brushed bronze to be installed over the original plaque, flush with the building. The plaque was originally installed in 1988 to recognize Paul E. Reinhold, who served on the Board of Directors of the VLSC for over 40 years. The Paul E. & Kiare N. Reinhold Foundation contributed a generous grant that helped to make restoration of the station possible.

The City has included a capital project in the FY2027 budget to replace the roof of the Lifesaving Station with a metal roof. The new roof will meet all applicable high-wind zone code requirements. City staff and members of the VLSC selected a light gray metal color for the roof and presented the color choice to City Council at the July 13 briefing. There was a consensus to select Portland Stone as the color for the new metal roof.

RESOLUTION NO. 2219-2026

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE OFFICIAL LOGO FOR THE JACKSONVILLE BEACH LIFESAVING STATION; PROVIDING FOR BRANDING OF THE LIFESAVING STATION; PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF RECITALS, REPEAL OF PRIOR INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS AND COUNCIL DECISIONS, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville Beach has a long and proud history of providing ocean rescue services through the City of Jacksonville Beach's professional lifeguards of the Ocean Rescue division and the Volunteer Life Saving Corps; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of its historical significance and continued service to public safety, the City of Jacksonville Beach wishes to formally adopt the official logo and branding design of the Jacksonville Beach Lifesaving Station located at 2 Oceanfront North; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of a logo and branding design will enhance the building's identity and honor its lifesaving mission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. ADOPTION OF RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are deemed true and material parts of this resolution and are fully incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. ADOPTION OF THE LOGO. The City Council hereby formally adopts the logo for the Jacksonville Beach Lifesaving Station, attached hereto as Attachment A.

SECTION 3. ADOPTION OF THE BRANDING DESIGN. Branding shall include the placement of the Jacksonville Beach Lifesaving Station logo on the top three (north, east, and south) tower facades; placement of the wording "Home of the Volunteer Lifesaving Corps Since 1912" across the south side of the building; placement of the wording "Home of Jacksonville Beach Ocean Rescue" on the west side of the building; and placement of the Jacksonville Beach Ocean Rescue logo and the Volunteer Lifesaving Corps logo on the east side of the building as shown in Attachment B.

SECTION 4. REPEAL OF PRIOR INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS AND COUNCIL DECISIONS. All prior resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, clause, or provision of this resolution should be held invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional, said determination shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force, or effect of any other section, sentence, phrase, or portion of this resolution not otherwise determined to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage and adoption by City Council.

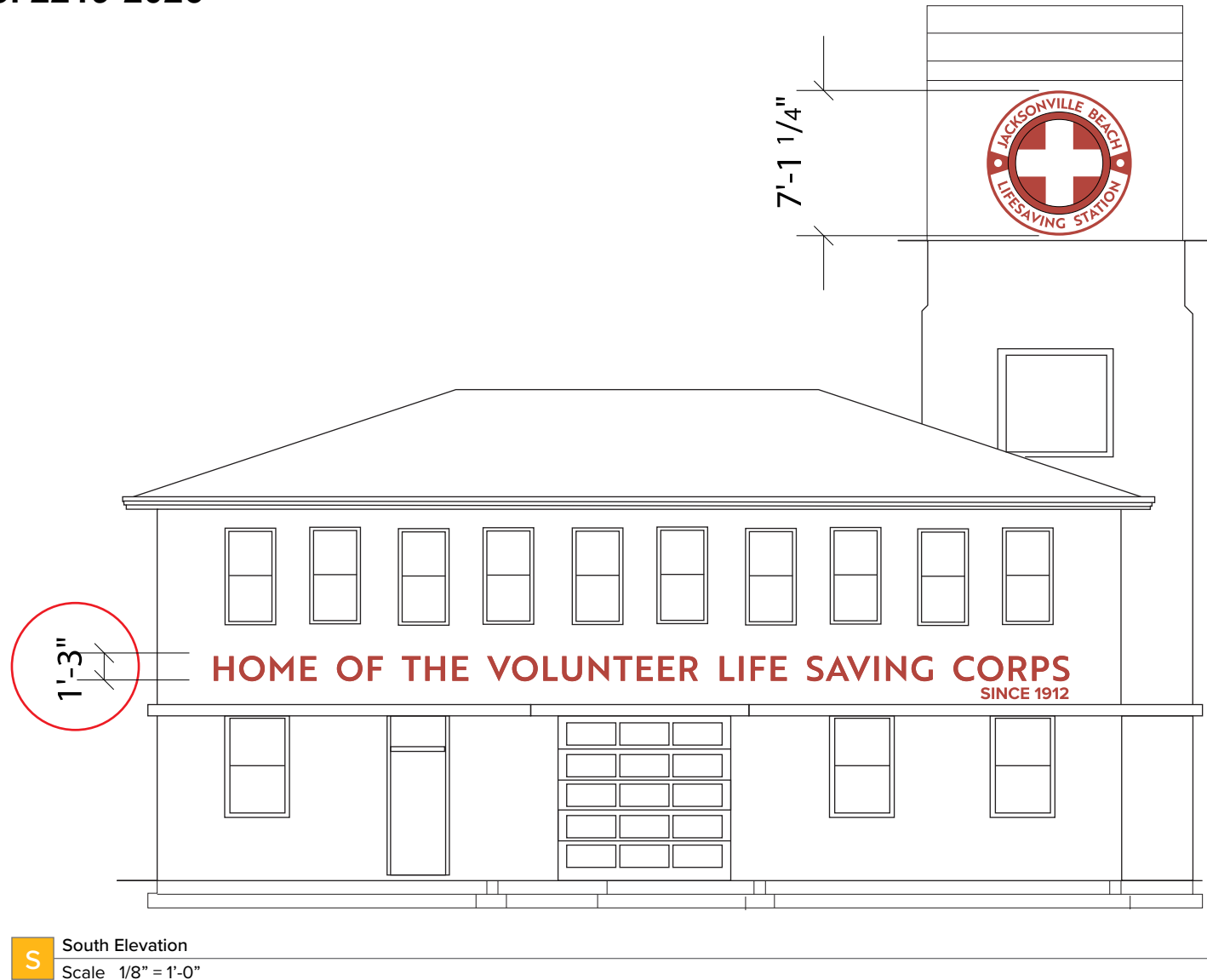

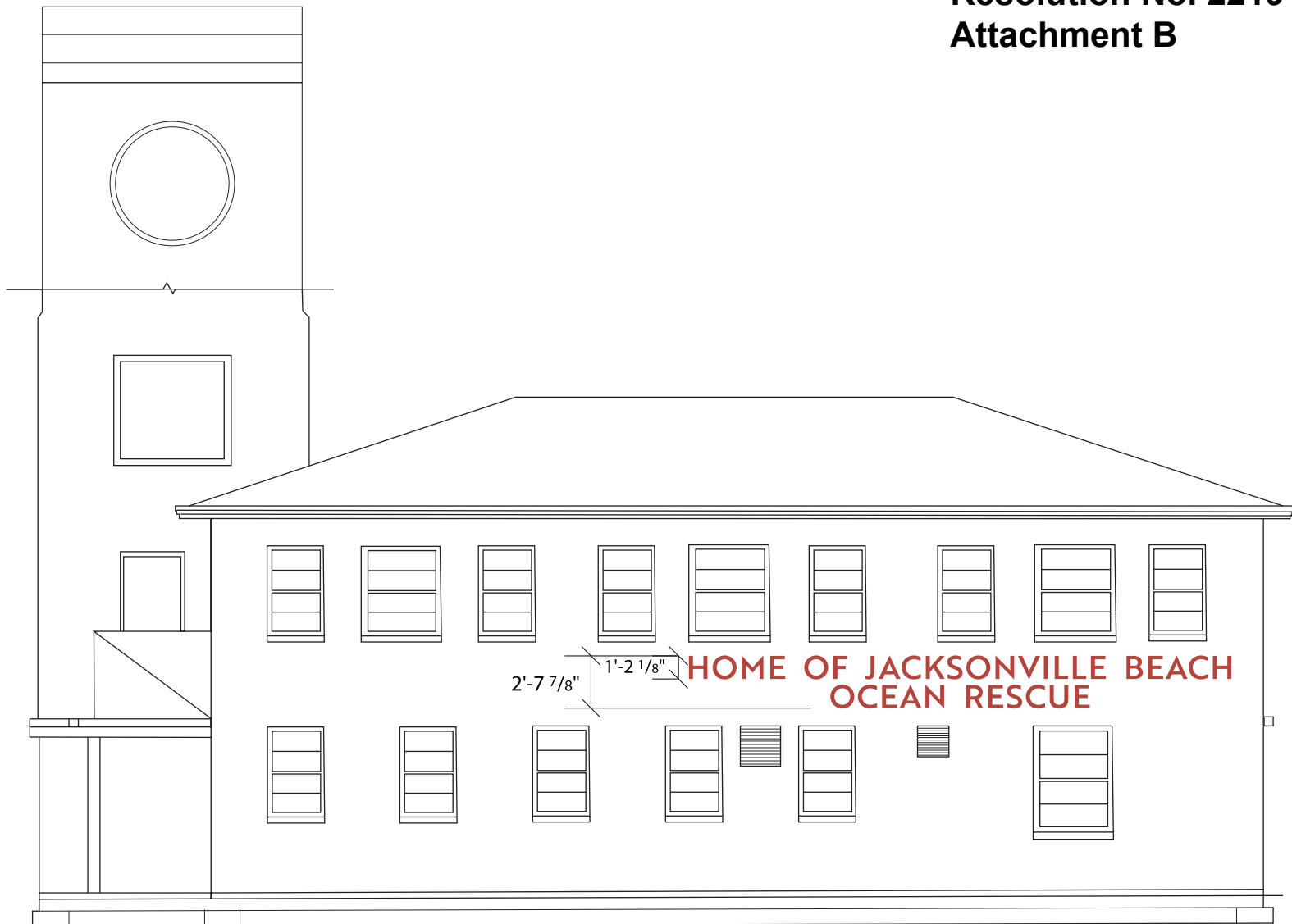
East Elevation

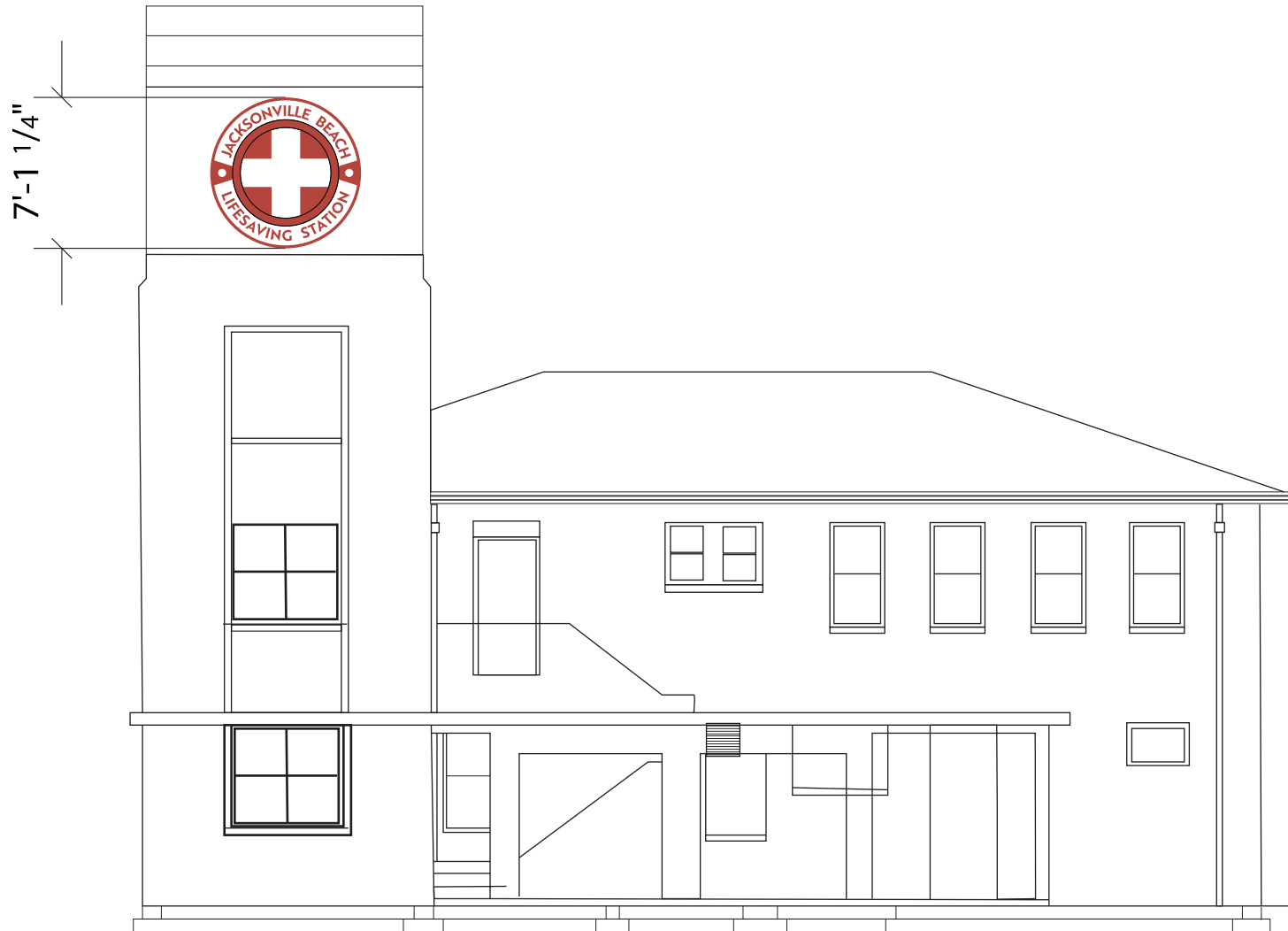


W West Elevation

BACKGROUND

During the April 13, 2026, Council Briefing, Council Member Golding raised an incident of animal cruelty in an Atlantic Beach dog park, which she said resulted in the alleged offender's membership being revoked. After learning of the incident, Council Member Golding reviewed the City's Code of Ordinances and found no provision authorizing the City to revoke such persons' Paws Dog Park membership.

It was the consensus of the Council to have the City Attorney draft updated language to be added to the code, which would allow the City to exclude animal cruelty offenders from Paws Dog Park.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-8239

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 20, SECTION 20-15 “PAWS DOG PARK,” OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (c) AUTHORIZING THE DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION OF MEMBERSHIP FOR CERTAIN PERSONS INVESTIGATED FOR OR CONVICTED OF ANIMAL CRUELTY OR RELATED OFFENSES; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT, CODIFICATION, REPEAL OF CONFLICTS, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville Beach (the “City”) has the authority to adopt this Ordinance pursuant to Art. VIII § 2 of the Constitution of the State of Florida; and Chapter 166 Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City owns, operates, and maintains the Paws Dog Park as a membership-required recreational facility governed by Section 20-15 of the Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Section 20-15 requires membership to access the Paws Dog Park and authorizes the removal of visitors, the suspension of park privileges, and the revocation of membership under the circumstances described therein; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 828, Florida Statutes, establishes offenses relating to cruelty to animals; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that persons who have been convicted of, or are being investigated for, animal cruelty or related offenses may present a risk to the animals and users of the Paws Dog Park; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to establish a fair process by which membership and access to the Paws Dog Park may be denied, suspended, or revoked for such persons; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the adoption of this Ordinance serves a legitimate governmental purpose, is a permissible exercise of the City’s powers and authority, benefits the health, safety, and welfare of the City’s citizens, and serves to protect and preserve City property for the public benefit.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. RECITALS AND LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The above recitals and legislative findings are ratified, correct and made a part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. SECTION 20-15 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, FLORIDA, IS HEREBY AMENDED BY ADDING SUBSECTION (c) TO READ AS FOLLOWS¹:

(c) Denial, suspension, or revocation of membership and access for animal cruelty offenses.

(1) Definitions. For the purpose of this subsection:

a. "Animal cruelty offense" means a violation of any provision of Chapter 828, Florida Statutes, or any substantially similar offense under the law of another state, territory, or the United States.

(2) Authority. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the city manager or designee may immediately deny, suspend, or revoke the membership and park-access privileges of any person who has been convicted of an animal cruelty offense or is being investigated for such an offense. This authority is in addition to, and does not limit, the removal, suspension, and revocation authority provided anywhere else in the Code of Ordinances.

(3) Reinstatement. Any person whose membership is suspended or revoked pursuant to this subsection may seek reinstatement by written request to the city manager or designee. Reinstatement is at the discretion of the city manager or designee. If reinstatement is granted, it shall be contingent upon proof of completion of an animal cruelty prevention and education course.

(4) Enforcement. A person whose membership or access has been denied, suspended, or revoked under this subsection and who thereafter enters or remains at the Paws Dog Park may be removed and may be subject to arrest and/or prosecution for criminal trespass.

SECTION 3. CODIFICATION. The City Council intends that this Ordinance will be made a part of and codified in the City of Jacksonville Beach Code of Ordinances.

SECTION 4. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES. All ordinances and resolutions previously adopted or entered into by the City that are in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder shall not be affected by such invalidity.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance will immediately take effect upon its adoption by the City Council.
