

The Council Workshop began at 5:33 P.M.

Also present were City Manager Mike Staffopoulos, City Attorney Sandy Robinson, City Clerk Sheri Gosselin, and Attorney Cliff Shepard.

Purpose of Workshop

The purpose of the workshop was to review Sections 54 through 59 of the City's Charter and recommend any revisions.

Attorney Cliff Shepard presented proposed revisions [on file] to be considered to the City Charter regarding the following sections:

- Section 54. Water, sewer, gas, electric, garbage collection and disposal or incineration services and facilities.
- Section 55. Amusement or recreation pier.
- Section 56. Franchises.
- Section 57. Ocean beach.
- Section 57(a). Preservation of ocean accesses.
- Section 58. County and state roads.
- Section 59. Damage suits.

Mr. Shepard addressed questions related to special and general elections referenced in Sections 55 and 57(a). He noted he would look into the possibility of adding "general election" to Section 55.

The consensus of the Council was to move forward with the proposed changes. These changes would be added to the draft ordinance submitting all the proposed changes to be considered for a referendum at the next general election.

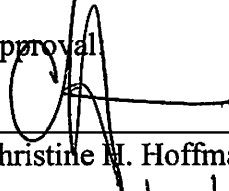
Mr. Staffopoulos stated the Charter Review Workshop scheduled for October 28, 2021, would include the following:

- Discuss any new items the Council would like to add to the Charter

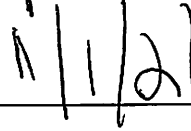
The workshop adjourned at 5:46 P.M.
